RATIONALE Social Science The Providence College Mission Statement reminds the community of the "unity of the human family that proceeds from its one Creator" and "encourages the deepest respect for the essential dignity, freedom, and equality of every person." The mission also requires that the College help students to develop a more reasoned and thorough understanding of their own society and culture as well as those of others. To honor these imperatives and accomplish these goals, the curriculum must promote critical understanding of individual and collective human behavior and institutions, precisely the subject matter of the social sciences. Social science entails the application of quantitative and qualitative methods to the study of human social institutions and behavior. Through the application and study of such methods, and through analytic reflection on the concepts and theories employed by the social science disciplines, students should deepen their commitment to the Truth and develop the knowledge and the critical abilities needed to become informed, engaged citizens of American society and the world. It is for these reasons that the core curriculum includes a social science requirement.
